ALL ABOUT YOUTH TOUR





Youth Tour is an opportunity for high school juniors to compete for trips to Montgomery and Washington, D.C., to learn about electric cooperatives and our nation's history.

In Montgomery, delegates will join other students from across Alabama for leadership activities, visits to the state capitol and museums, meetings with state legislators, a dinner dance and other fun activities.

In Washington, D.C., students will enjoy sightseeing and tour attractions including Arlington National Cemetery, Mount Vernon, Vietnam Memorial, Washington Monument, Lincoln Memorial, Martin Luther King, Jr., Memorial, FDR Memorial, and many more. The group will also visit Mount Vernon and tour Smithsonian museums such as the Holocaust Museum, American History Museum, National Archives, Museum of Natural History and others. It's truly the trip of a lifetime!

HOW TO APPLY

This contest is open to all high school juniors in Clarke, Washington, Wilcox and Monroe counties, or if your parents/guardians are members of Clarke-Washington EMC, you are eligible to apply. YOU DO NOT HAVE TO BE A MEMBER. Students must submit a video on the topic below. Students must also submit a resume to include academic achievements, work experience, extracurricular activities, volunteer work, employment, and any other accomplishments or endeavors that tell us about your character and work ethic.



THE VIDEO

In your video, share your personal story—who you are, your background, interests, and the experiences that have shaped your character. Reflect on your core values and how they guide your actions and decisions. Clarke-Washington EMC's five core values are Safety, Integrity, Positive Attitude, Respect, and Dependability. Consider how your own values align with or differ from these, and explain why they make you a strong candidate for Youth Tour.

THE RULES

The video must be 3-5 minutes long. Use your Judges will review the videos and resumes to creativity-storytelling, visuals, music, interviews, select the top two students from each school for animation, or any format that best represents you. We want to see your personality, your passion, and your vision for the future.

Students must complete and submit a video and resume on our website by January 8, 2026, at 4pm. 9000 Highway 43. The resume must be typed and the font size should be no larger than 12 point..

THE INTERVIEW

Four students will be selected from the interview process to attend an all-expenses-paid trip to the Montgomery Youth Tour in March. They will also receive a \$500 scholarship.

Of those four, two students will be selected to be awarded an all expenses paid trip to Washington D.C. in June. Those two students will receive an additional \$500 scholarship.

The scholarships shall be transmitted to the accredited school selected by the scholarship recipient upon graduation.



You will be interviewed by a panel of three judges. They will ask

questions about Clarke-Washington EMC, electric cooperatives and yourself. You may be asked about school activities, family and college or career plans.

INTERVIEW TIPS

The judges will be considering your knowledge of cooperatives, communication skills, poise and appearance.

Always remember to speak up, do not chew gum during the interview. make eye contact with the judges and be personable.

WHAT TO WEAR

We ask that you dress in business attire. Listed are example of what to wear.

Ladies: Dress, pantsuit, dressy blouse with slacks. Skirts and dresses should be no shorter than 2 inches above the knee. No strapless or spaghetti straps.

Gentlemen: Dress slacks/khakis, button down, tie, and optional sports coat.
